Attendees will be given time to travel for food for lunch. The day is made up of a combination of competitions and workshops. Throughout the day participants will have the opportunity to take part in workshops led by our members, alumni and community members.

The winners of each section and subsection along with the club gathering the highest points will be announced during the banquet.

SECTION A: Dancing

1. Square Dance Competition

- Each club is entitled to enter one set which will consist of four couples and a caller.
 Callers and dancers must all be current Junior Farmer members
- Each entry will dance one dance of their choosing
- Marks will be given primarily for sets dancing as a team in executing square dance patterns. No points will be given for entry or exit of sets, but these are considered under enthusiasm and overall entertainment value

2. Square Dance Callers Competition - Judged during the Square Dance Competition

This competition will be held simultaneously with the square dance competition

3. Two Stepping Competition

- Music will be supplied and each dance competition will require contestants to dance the duration of a minimum of two songs
- A maximum of two couples from each club may enter

4. Line Dancing

- Each club is entitled to one entry (minimum two dancers) in this competition
- Dancers are responsible for providing their own music
- The dance is expected to run the duration of one song (no longer than 5 minutes)
- The line dance must be an original dance created by the group. A deduction will be given for any non-original dances.

5. Tik Tok Challenge

- Each club may enter up to 2 entries
- TikToks can either be recorded prior to the event and shown during or performed during the competition
- TikToks may be original content or a remake of a trending video. It must be appropriate content. Any inappropriate content will be disqualified
- TikToks will be judged on creativity, enthusiasm, member participate and entertainment

SECTION B: MUSIC

- Each club may enter up to 2 entries in each category
- Each entry will be required to prepare one song, maximum 5 minutes
- Instrumental/musical accompaniment will be permitted, but must be provided by the club. If using recorded music, lyrics must not be audible.
- For the instrumental competition, sheet music must be presented to the judges prior to performing, and it is also allowed on stage

Categories

- 1. Vocal Group 3 or more members
- 2. Vocal Duet Any 2 members
- 3. Vocal Male Solo
- 4. Vocal Female Solo
- 5. Instrumental Solo any instrument; keyboard can be provided upon request

SECTION C: THINKING ON YOUR FEET

Each club may have 2 entries into each category

1. Impromptu Public Speaking Competition

- Entrants will draw a topic on an item in a random fashion
- Entrants will be given 30 seconds to prepare
- The entrants will have 1 minute to talk about their chosen topic or item
- Speeches will be judged on creativity, clarity of thought, delivery and effectiveness
- Each entrant is able to redraw ONE time

2. Spelling Bee

 Entrants will be allowed to ask for a definition and/or for the word to be used in a sentence

SECTION D: HOME CRAFTS

- Any entries in these competitions must be submitted by 10:00am, when judging will take place. The results and entries will be displayed for everyone to see.
- When you arrive at the hall with your entry you will be directed to the correct tables that will be set up. Cards will be available upon arrival to attach to your entries
- Clubs are able to enter up to 2 entries into each competition
- · Baking items must include a recipe

- Each club may enter up to 2 entries in each competition
- · Please include the variety on the entry card
- Please have your entry in place for judging by 10am

- 4. Soybeans 5 stalks
- 5. Dry 1st cut hay 1 small square flake
- 6. Most unusual looking vegetable
- 7. Corn silage no larger than a large ziploc bag
- 8. Haylage no larger than a large ziploc bag

SECTION G: ENTERTAINMENT

1. Lip-Sync Battle

- Each club may enter up to 2 competitors
- The competition will start with all competitors lip-syncing to the same song and the judges will use an elimination process. The remaining 2-3 competitors will move onto the finals. The songs will be selected from this list:
 - A Whole New World From Aladdin
 - Waka Waka (This Time for Africa) Shakira
 - Party in the USA Miley Cyrus
 - Rockin' in the Free World Neil Young
 - Waiting on the World to Change John Mayer
 - It's a Small World
- The finals will take place at the banquet. Each finalist will select a song of their choice (must be family-friendly) to perform at the banquet.
- Props and costumes are allowed and encouraged

2. Gong Show Competition

- Each club may enter 1 entry in this competition
- Presentations shall include skits, demonstrations, tablets, and musical activities not specified in any other areas of Sing Swing
- 10 minutes will be allowed for set-up, performance and takedown
- This competition will run like a traditional Gong Show, and contestants will be gonged off the stage at the judge's discretion
- The winner of the Gong Show will show off their Gong Show talents at the banquet, as part of the Entertainment Showcase
- All entries in the Gong Show must be appropriate for all ages. Inappropriate entries will be disqualified

SPECIAL: Movember Moustache/Beard Competition

 Trim up and get the gel out for this one! This competition you can show off your beard or 'stache at the banquet
